- Surgical Neurosciences is a 28-bed unit, serving patients of all acuity levels and all ages. The typical nurse-patient ratio is 1:3-4.
- Hematology-oncology is a 28-bed unit, serving children of all acuity levels and all ages. The typical nurse-patient ratio is 1:3-4 for hematology-oncology and 1:2 for blood and marrow transplant.
- Pediatric Medicine is a 41-bed unit, serving patients up to age 21. The typical nurse-patient ratio is 1:3 or 1:4
