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Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit

The cardiovascular intensive care unit (CVICU) provides specialized care to medical and surgical patients with congenital and acquired heart disease. Our multidisciplinary team cares for patients ranging in age from newborn to adulthood across the spectrum of their hospital course, as an admission to discharge unit.

What to Expect

- Orientation lasts 22 weeks
- Ongoing education is a priority in the CVICU. We offer simulation, lectures, weekly surgical case discussions, operative huddles and Advanced Cardiovascular Education (ACE), a one-week comprehensive cardiac curriculum, is offered to all new employees.
- After orientation, positions are 12-hour rotating shifts for the first year, in two-month cycles
