- Surgical Neurosciences is a 28-bed unit, serving patients of all acuity levels and all ages. Our typical nurse-patient ratio is 1:3-4.
- Unique to our unit are six designated beds that accommodate video EEG monitoring.
- The epilepsy monitoring unit has received accreditation as a Level IV epilepsy center by the National Association of Epilepsy Centers (NAEC) as well as ABRET Neurodiagnostic Credentialing and Accr-mceditation.
