Frequently Asked Questions

- **Am I applying for a pharmacy technician position?** No. You are applying to become a pharmacy technician trainee, which is a temporary position for the duration of the program.
- **What is the rate of pay as a pharmacy technician trainee?** You will be paid \$15.91/hour (full-time, 40hr/wk, varied shifts) while in the training program. Upon successful program completion and obtaining the Florida Board of Pharmacy registration, trainees will be promoted to a Pharmacy Technician position, with a \$16.77/hour pay rate.

About the Program

This is a **full-time, 14-week training program** that provides robust didactic courses in conjunction with hands-on simulation activities and rotation experience at John Hopkins All Children's Hospital.

The cost of the program is absorbed by the hospital and has no cost to you.

Training program is approved by the Florida Board of Pharmacy, and currently in candidate status for ASHP/ACPE accreditation review.

How to Apply for the Program

- Complete the Pharmacy Technician Trainee job application on Johns Hopkins Careers website
- Schedule and complete the math and reading pre-assessments
- Selected candidates will undergo the interview process
- Up to 4 pharmacy technician trainees will be selected per cohort

Admission Requirements

- Hold a High school diploma, GED, or equivalent.
- Application is open to both internal and external candidates. For current employees who are applying, must be at JHHS for a minimum of 6 months, be eligible for internal transfer and be in good standing.
- Pass the pre-enrollment math and reading comprehension assessments by achieving a score of at least 70%.
- Completion of all the steps as required for employment at Johns Hopkins (including background checks, and occupational health screening)

What Should I Expect After Completion?

- Upon successfully completing the program, students are eligible to register as a pharmacy technician with the Florida Board of Pharmacy. Your position will then be advanced to pharmacy technician.
- Trainees are encouraged to obtain PTCB national certification
- We ask that every trainee who complete the program to work full-time as a pharmacy technician at John Hopkins All Children's Hospital for a minimum of **one year**.
