

## Johns Hopkins Pediatric Radiology COVID-19 Safety Guidelines

## Your safety is our number one priority








In the hallways and waiting room areas, you'll see patients and staff wearing cloth or surgical masks, just like you!



Our waiting rooms are spaced further apart for social distancing. The new, temporary visitor's policy is that only one parent can accompany their child.



During your MRI exam, you might see staff wearing face shields or different types of masks. This is an extra layer of protection for hospital workers.



We carefully clean all the equipment before and after every patient. We use special cleaning products to make sure everything is properly sanitized.
