



Mammary Cancer Trial in Dogs

Summary: To assess the effectiveness of cryoablation to minimize cancerous growth in mammary tumors. Cryoablation is a freezing technique that can kill tumors.

Funding and Support: The pet owner is responsible for the cost of obtaining staging of the mammary cancer. The cryotherapy and mass removal are fully funded.

Trial Eligibility: Dogs of any breed, sex, and age are eligible.

Inclusion Criteria

- Histopathological confirmation of mammary cancer
- Systemically healthy other than cancer diagnosis
- No prior treatment for lump or chemotherapy for other cancers
- The dog's owner has the ability to understand and to sign a written informed consent document and is willing to comply with study protocol
- Other restrictions may apply, please call for details

Exclusion Criteria

- Dogs who have previously received chemotherapy or other investigational agents
- Existence of life-threatening medical or immunosuppressive illnesses unrelated to cancer
- Dogs already participating in another study

Trial Timeline: Eligible dogs will receive routine bloodwork and a physical exam in addition to cryotherapy. A few weeks after the cryotherapy procedure, the dog will have the mass surgically removed. Follow up assessments will be performed either by telephone or in person at no cost to the owner.
