

# The Johns Hopkins Driving Program

The Johns Hopkins Driving Program at Green Spring Station provides comprehensive assessments of the impact a medical condition may have on driver safety. In addition, the program offers evaluations for people who may not have a medical condition, but due to normal aging may have driving risk factors. People with the following diagnoses may benefit from participation in the Driving Program:

- Alzheimer's disease
- Amputation
- Dementia
- Head injury
- Low vision
- Lower-extremity paralysis
- Multiple sclerosis
- Orthopedic conditions
- Parkinson's disease
- Stroke



Patients are oriented to the vehicle process before an in-vehicle assessment begins.

## A full driving evaluation includes

- A clinical assessment testing vision, physical skills, reaction time, cognitive processing and visual perception
- A behind-the-wheel assessment utilizing a hospital vehicle (one to two sessions)
- A conference to discuss results and recommendations
- Driver training if appropriate to remediate skill deficits
- Adaptive equipment training

The referral process includes a prescription from a physician. The program is fee-for-services with payment due at the time of service in the form of cash or check. The client must also be able to transfer into and out of an automobile at the time of assessment.
