

Occupational Therapy Home Assessments

Home Assessments

- are a one-time assessment designed to evaluate the environment and a person's ability to perform daily life tasks within a familiar setting
- can clarify for patients and families current strengths and areas that require additional support and/or supervision

People with the following medical diagnoses may benefit from a home assessment

- Low vision
- Dementia
- Parkinson's disease
- Alzheimer's disease
- Chronic mental illness

Questions that a home assessment may answer about a person's functional ability

- What adaptive equipment would help the person be more independent with dressing and showering?
- How much time can the person be alone?
- Is the person safe to perform basic household tasks like cooking?
- Is there a medication administration system available to make the person more organized and compliant?
- What tasks in the home are reasonable for the person to perform?
