



# TAKE PART IN RESEARCH ON ADHD!

## ATTENTION: PARENTS OF CHILDREN GRADES 4 THROUGH 8:

We are recruiting children to participate in a study to learn if there are differences in the way children *with* and *without* ADHD learn to read and remember what they have read.

- WHO:** Children, ages 9 - 14/grades 4 - 8, with ADHD or children who do not have ADHD to participate as "comparison subjects"
- WHAT:** 2 to 3 days (about 3 to 5 hours each day) of computer games, paper & pencil tasks and a Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) and Electrophysiological (EEG) studies of the brain. You will receive the results of the IQ testing and a picture of your brain. Parents will complete questionnaires, rating scales, and a structured interview.
