Directions to Johns Hopkins Bayview

From points South (including BWI Airport):

Take I-295 north or I-95 north to the Harbor Tunnel Thruway (I-895). After exiting the tunnel, take exit 12 (Lombard St.). At the first stop light, proceed straight onto Bayview Blvd. Follow signs to Mid-Campus Parking Lot.

From points North and East:

Take I-95 south to I-895 south to exit 12 (Lombard St.). At the first stop light, turn right onto Bayview Blvd. Follow signs to Mid-Campus Parking Lot.

From East Baltimore or Dundalk Area:

Take Eastern Ave. At the first stoplight, turn onto Bayview Blvd. (Make left if coming from East Baltimore, right from Dundalk). Follow signs to Mid-Campus Parking Lot.
