## Would you know what to do if you discovered a fire?

Of course, leave the building. Everybody knows that!

Is there any thing else you should do? Certainly! Sound the alarm and alert others.

Do you know how? Everyone should learn how to activate the fire alarm systems in the buildings where they live, work and play.

Look for and remember where the nearest fire alarm and exit is.

Know the evacuation plan for your building. Remember where the assigned meeting location is if your building has one.

The International Fire Code and OSHA standards require employees to be familiar with fire alarm systems in their work areas.

***Know what you need to do ... it may save your life!***

## REMEMBER:

**R**emove yourself from immediate harm and close doors on your way.

**A**ctivate the alarm by pulling the alarm handle.

**C**all Security 6-7777 or 911. Do this from a safe location.

**E**vacuate the building to a safe distance or assigned meeting location.
