Pediatric Inpatient Pharmacy Johns Hopkins Hospital On-site	The Pediatric Pharmacy at Johns Hopkins Hospital (JHH) services the 180 bed acute care JHH Children's Center as well as the neighboring Kennedy Krieger Institute, a pediatric rehabilitation center.
Osler 2 Inpatient Pharmacy Johns Hopkins Hospital On-site	In the Osler 2 Inpatient Pharmacy, pharmacists and pharmacy technicians care for a wide variety of patients, including Internal Medicine, Surgery, Neurology, Neurosurgery, Psychiatry, Obstetrics, Rehabilitation, Ophthalmology, and the Adult Emergency Room.
Carnegie 6 Inpatient Pharmacy Johns Hopkins Hospital On-site	In the Carnegie 6 Critical Care/Surgery Inpatient Pharmacy, pharmacists and pharmacy technicians care for critical care adults in 5 different ICUs, solid organ transplant patients and patients in the operating rooms within the hospital.
Weinberg Inpatient Pharmacy Johns Hopkins Hospital On-site	Weinberg pharmacy provides pharmaceutical care for patients in the Weinberg Building. The areas covered include inpatient adult oncology, hematology and bone marrow transplantation units, surgical units, and a surgical intensive care unit. Additionally the large adult oncology outpatient clinic is located in this building, and is covered by this pharmacy.
Central Pharmacy Johns Hopkins Hospital On-site	The Central Pharmacy is an inpatient pharmacy production area that serves all patient populations and includes Cart Fill for adult patients only, Sterile compounding preparations (i.e., IV bags), Pyxis refills for non-controlled substances, Controlled Substance distribution via Pyxis, Non sterile compounding (i.e., unit dose).
Pharmacy Administration Johns Hopkins Hospital On-site Administration	Working with the Associate Director of Medication Informatics and Central Pharmacy Services, the Intern will complete projects involving a broad range of topics including the following: centralized pharmacy operations, coordination of pharmacy operations, automation, and human resource management.
Pharmacy Automation and Technology Johns Hopkins Hospital Off-site 2010 Building Administration	Experience involves the activities involved with planning, implementing, maintaining and improving processes using clinical applications and automated systems in the hospital based inpatient environment. The Intern is responsible for working with the Pharmacy Information Systems team to plan and implement new clinical applications, review and measure the performance of existing clinical applications.
Pharmacy Outcomes and Policy Johns Hopkins Hospital On-site Administration	The Center for Pharmaceutical Outcomes and Policy focuses on practical application of outcomes research and pharmacoeconomic principals to help the institution make better clinical and resource allocation decisions.

Outpatient Pharmacy Operations Home Care Group Off-site – Holabird Avenue Administration	<p>Outpatient Pharmacy Operations involves the oversight of staffing, managers meetings, program development, policy and procedure issues, inventory control, disciplinary actions and maintaining the operational dashboards. Although the Intern would have clinical involvement, the emphasis would be operations. This rotation would be ideal for an individual who is looking at a future manager’s role or an MBA program.</p>
Weinberg Outpatient Pharmacy Home Care Group On-site	<p>The Outpatient Pharmacy at the Weinberg Center fills prescriptions for oncology patients treated at the Outpatient Clinics. This pharmacy compounds a large variety of specialty drugs for pediatric oncology patients as well as specialty formulations for the patients of the Wilmer Eye Clinic that otherwise would not be available outside of the hospital.</p>
Pharmaquip Infusion Services Home Care Group Off-site	<p>Pharmaquip Infusion Services is a specialty pharmacy providing safe and effective infusion therapies to patients at home. All sterile admixture products (TPN, antibiotics, chemotherapy, hydration, pain management, etc) are compounded in a USP 797 compliance clean room environment.</p>
Howard County Outpatient Pharmacy Home Care Group Off-site – Howard County General	<p>The Johns Hopkins Outpatient Center Pharmacy is a retail pharmacy serving the outpatient clinics, inpatient discharge patients, international patients, and walk-ins from the community. Approximately 300-350 prescriptions per day with 4 pharmacists and 7 technicians.</p>
Moore Clinic Outpatient Pharmacy Home Care Group On-site	<p>The Moore Outpatient Pharmacy is a specialty retail pharmacy in a clinical setting. Over 98% of our prescription volume pertains to HIV/AIDS related medications. Most of our patients are referred to us from the Moore Clinic and the Baltimore City Health Departments, as well as discharge patients.</p>
Monument Street Outpatient Pharmacy Home Care Group On-site	<p>The Monument Street Pharmacy is a typical retail setting serving the general population as well as transplant patients. Pharmacists fill a large amount of prescriptions and counsel patients.</p>
Johns Hopkins Bayview Outpatient Pharmacy Home Care Group Off-site – Johns Hopkins Bayview	<p>The Johns Hopkins Outpatient Pharmacy at Bayview Medical Center is a 250-300 script/day pharmacy that services the Baltimore area. This is a true retail pharmacy with special programs in place that differentiate it from a typical chain pharmacy.</p>
Outpatient Pharmacy Administration Home Care Group Off-site – Holabird Administration	<p>Outpatient Pharmacy Administration is part of a cross functional team consisting of pharmacists, pharmacy technicians, human resource employees, information technology experts, finance representatives, and support service representatives, who work in a collaborative practice to support outpatient pharmacy teams that provide dispensing and medication management services to the patients of Johns Hopkins Medicine.</p>

<p>Outpatient Pharmacy Clinical Applications Home Care Group Off-site – Holabird Administration</p>	<p>The Outpatient Pharmacy Clinical Applications team works primarily with the Outpatient Pharmacy system (HBS) and the Outpatient Pharmacy staff to update and maintain the clinical aspects of the system. In addition, the Clinical Applications team evaluates and implements the pharmacy POS system, Pyxis CII safe, automation, and various software and hardware necessary to improve the safety and efficiency of the outpatient pharmacies.</p>
<p>Outpatient Pharmacy Quality Improvement Home Care Group Off-site – Holabird Administration</p>	<p>Outpatient Pharmacy Quality Improvement works on quality improvement initiatives within the pharmacy department. Such initiatives include analyzing medication errors, performing root cause analysis, conducting failure mode and effects analysis, monthly auditing and assessment of safety objectives in the pharmacies, and weekly safety rounds.</p>
<p>Education Training and Personnel Development Johns Hopkins Hospital On-site – 2010 Building Administration</p>	<p>The Education Division of the Department of Pharmacy is responsible for the orientation and training of new employees and the ongoing education of pharmacy staff. Pharmacy Educators provide in-services and other hands-on training for new policies, drug therapies, and other pharmacy-related activities.</p>
<p>Decentralized and Clinical Pharmacy Services Johns Hopkins Hospital On-site Administration</p>	<p>Decentralized and Clinical Pharmacy Services oversee all clinical aspects of pharmaceutical care that the Department of Pharmacy provides, such as Pharmacy and Therapeutics decisions and safety issues.</p>
