

Hospitalist Sub-Intern Schedule

Time	Event	Description
7am	Sign-in rounds on Halsted 6	Please make the hospitalists aware of which patients you are following or will be learning. Also let them know if you are on-call that day.
7am-9am	Work rounds	You will be expected to obtain vital signs, get a brief sign-out of overnight events from the nurses, examine the patient, review orders placed the previous evening, and follow-up on labs/studies.
9am-10am	Integrated rounds with social worker, nurses and NC III starts at 9:00 a.m.	You will be expected to ask nursing if there are specific issues that need to be addressed. Discuss with the NCIII if PT, OT, substance abuse, palliative care, nutrition, or speech consults are needed. Discuss with social work the needs of the patient.
10am-11am 10:30am- Intern report on Thursdays.	Present your patients to the attending hospitalist- this may include walk-rounds with the attending Note: Some or all of this may occur during integrated rounds	You will be expected to give a concise presentation of your patient(s) including interval history, vital signs, physical exam, assessment, and a comprehensive treatment plan for the patient including a discussion of discharge planning.
11am- until sign-out	Admit two patients and/or continue caring for your patients on the service	1)New Admission: You will independently perform a comprehensive H&P on your patient, input orders, and present the patient to the admitting hospitalist. 2) Continuing care: You will call in consults and study requests, place orders, perform procedures, follow up on test results, complete your progress notes by 1pm, and talk with the PCP, family, and consultants.
12noon- 1pm	Noon conference/lunch	Cader Room M, T, Th and sub-I conference on Wed.
1pm on Monday and Friday	Didactic session with the hospitalist. Sub-Interns present the last Friday of the rotation	Core acute care medicine topics will be covered.
3pm-3:30pm	Group sign-out to afternoon/evening attending	You will give a 2-3 sentence summary of your patients and sign-out outstanding labs, radiology tests and consults for follow-up.
3:30pm -10pm	On call M, W, F or T, Th, Sat	When you are on call you will be available until 10pm with the afternoon/evening attending. There is NO overnight call. You will carry the beeper and be first call for cross-cover issues with your attending as back-up for help. You must notify your attending IMMEDIATELY about any urgent or emergent patients care issues. Please forward HAL calls to the afternoon hospitalist.
Weekends on call (8am-8pm)	Perform routine duties on your patients as during the week	There should be new admissions.
