

Guidelines for Trainees' Support

School of Medicine policy does not require that trainees receive support from the School of Medicine. However, the following guidelines apply:

1. Trainees who are U.S. citizens should demonstrate sufficient support for their stay at JHUSOM. The School of Medicine requires that the department verify source and amount of financial support.
2. For trainees who are non-U.S. citizens, federal minimum stipend requirements are \$2,000 per month (\$24,000 annually) plus \$292 per month for each dependent. For non-US citizens, the Office of International Services requires documentation of support as part of the visa application process.
3. Trainees who have completed all Ph.D. or other doctoral work but are lacking final approval of their degree due to administrative policies at their home institution may be paid at the PGY-1 level used for postdoctoral fellows. The approved stipend range for JHUSOM postdoctoral fellows effective 7/1/2011 is from \$38,496 (minimum) to \$57,116 (maximum).
4. Trainees who are doctoral candidates in another school and will be supported by the JHUSOM appointing department are generally paid at our graduate student stipend level. The approved stipend level for JHUSOM graduate students effective 7/1/2011 is \$28,083 (subject to annual change).
