*In addition to these clinical rotations, the US based physician fellow will be recognized as an instructor within the JHU School of Medicine Gynecology and Obstetrics Department and be expected to spend time engaged in clinical/ surgical activities including but not limited to taking call (labor and delivery; gynecology), overseeing resident clinic, and attending their own obstetrics and gynecology clinics. The US based nurse fellow will be recognized as an instructor within the JHU School of Nursing and may also participate in the teaching and clinical mentorship of nursing studetns based on PhD requirements and personal interests.

The LMIC fellows will spend 1 month during the 2 year fellowship in the US. During their time here, they will spend time at the Jhpiego Global Program Office as well as rotating in various clinical services at JHU and engage with relevant mentors and faculty in the school of medicine, nursing and public health. During the clinical rotations, due to licensure requirements, the LMIC fellows will act as observers and will not be participating in patient care.
