[Johns Hopkins Medicine](#), headquartered in Baltimore, Maryland, is an \$11 billion nonprofit integrated global health enterprise and one of the leading health care systems in the United States.

With a mission to improve the health of the community and the world, Johns Hopkins Medicine has combined over 130 years of commitment to community care and has set the standard of excellence with groundbreaking research, education, and medical services worldwide.

The Johns Hopkins Hospital opened in 1889, followed by the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine in 1893. In 1986, the trustees established The Johns Hopkins Health System Corporation as the hospital's parent organization. A decade later, in 1996, the health system and the school of medicine unified to form Johns Hopkins Medicine.



Johns Hopkins Medicine employs more than 40,000 full-time faculty and staff members, integrating the operations of the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine with The Johns Hopkins Health System, and includes:

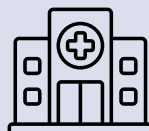
