This update contains pertinent information about changes that will impact the Johns Hopkins HealthCare provider network.

## Changes to Maryland Contraceptive Equity Act Take Effect July 1, 2018

Effective July 1, 2018, Priority Partners will allow the single dispensing of up to a 12-month supply of a contraceptive when ordered by a qualified provider.

Senate Bill 774/House Bill 994, which passed during the recent Maryland legislative session, also overturned previous legislation that allowed insurers to dispense a two-month supply of contraceptives for new family planning prescriptions. This previous legislation had been intended to ensure that the medication is well-tolerated and effective for the patient before prescribing a long-term dosage. The new Maryland bills eliminate the two-month supply and state that only a 12-month supply of contraceptives can be dispensed in a single prescription.

Priority Partners does not charge a copay for any contraceptives and may not require prior authorization for an intrauterine device (IUD) or implantable rod that is FDA-approved and obtained under a written prescription, unless the FDA has issued a black box warning (a warning on the prescription drug or device's label designed to call attention to serious or life-threatening risks).
