 - Trauma Nursing Core Course (TNCC)
 - Emergency Severity Index (ESI) Triage

ED Unit Overview

- 35 Bed Unit, including:
 - 2 Dedicated Trauma/Resuscitation rooms
 - 6 Designated "safe" rooms for mental health patients
- Variable nurse to patient ratios based on acuity
 - 1:1 for Trauma
 - 1:3-4 in Main Department
- Approximately 45,000 visits per year
- Opportunities for growth and development, such as:
 - Trauma Team
 - Medical Emergency Team
 - Preceptor/Mentor
 - Shared Governance
 - Research/QI
