

Abstract for Research Projects

The Johns Hopkins Center for Nursing Inquiry invites you to submit an abstract for the 2024 SHINE Conference. We are seeking submissions showcasing nurse-led, inquiry work. Use this form to write an abstract for research projects.

Instructions:

- 1) Complete this form by clicking the text fields and adding text.
- 2) Each text field has a character limit to indicate the maximum number of characters that can be entered into that field. There is no need to count characters. You will not be able to exceed the character limit.
- 3) Do not include any identifying information in your abstract, such as names, affiliations, units, or cities. For example, do not refer to the location of your project as "Bloomberg 9N" or "The Johns Hopkins Hospital"; refer to the location of your project as "a pediatric unit" or "a large, urban hospital".
- 4) To save the completed form, choose "Save As" from the file menu and rename the file.
- 5) Upload the completed form to your application.

Title
Indicate the name of your project. Your title should clear, concise, and reflect the focus of your project.
Character Limit: 225
Introduction
Describe the current state of the science and any other relevant information to justify your research. Be
sure to indicate if you are building on previous studies or addressing gaps in knowledge.
Character Limit: 575



Aim Briefly state the purpose of your project and your desired goal(s). Character Limit: 400
Methods Describe how your study was conducted. This includes information about the research design, study sample, interventions, data collection and analysis techniques. Character Limit: 750
Results Provide a summary of the results of the study. Character Limit: 575



Discussion
Discuss the significance of your findings, how they compare to the current available literature, and
implications for future research.
<u>Character Limit: 575</u>
References
List the recent, relevant and high-quality evidence used to write your abstract (e.g. peer-reviewed articles,
clinical guidelines, expert opinion, textbooks, organization policies/procedures, etc.). Evidence should be
published within the past 3-5 years. You may also include seminal works. References should be cited using
APA format.
