A 12-month fellowship program consisting of mentored advanced clinical practice in Hand Therapy and Occupational Therapy at our outpatient clinic, and scholarly activities including:

- Physician shadowing and observation of hand surgery; bi-weekly physician hand conference
- Quarterly journal club
- Weekly skills lab
- Didactics consisting of weekly clinic and online learning
- Evidence-based independent self-study and research for a case presentation or a quality improvement project in upper extremity rehabilitation

- National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy registration
- Three letters of reference
- At least one outpatient rehabilitation level II fieldwork experience
- Completion of the Physical Agents Modalities Certification course didactics
- Official university transcripts
- CV
- Essay
- Prefer one year of work experience in an outpatient clinic treating hand and upper extremity conditions
