The Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine Office of Alumni Relations is dedicated to fostering a lifelong connection between the school and its distinguished alumni. The office serves as a vital bridge, connecting alumni with learners, one another, and with their alma mater. Our mission is to enrich the lives of our alumni by providing opportunities for connection while cultivating a strong sense of community and supporting the institution's mission of excellence.

IMPACT THROUGH CONNECTION: ALUMNI SUPPORT FOR LEARNERS

WHITE COATS AND STETHOSCOPES

Alumni came together to make a big difference by sponsoring 118 stethoscopes and white coats for incoming medical students and 180 lab coats for graduate students. We raised \$53,420, surpassing our goal and ensuring every first-year medical students and graduate student received these meaningful gifts.

ORGANIZATIONAL SUPPORT

The JHMAA provides annual funds to learner organizations at the School of Medicine, including the House Staff Council, the Graduate Student Association, the Johns Hopkins Postdoctoral Association, and the Medical Student Senate. The Office of Alumni Relations also sponsored activities for the Graduate Student Association and Resident Appreciation Weeks.

STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

The JHMAA Centennial Endowed Scholarship provides medical students with financial aid. In FY26, the \$15,602 scholarship went to talented 3rd and 4th year students. The JHMAA also sponsored Young Investigators Awards for postdocs and fellows.

MATCH DAY AND CONVOCATION

The JHMAA helped make these milestones unforgettable by providing special gifts for Match Day, and by celebrating the Class of 2026 with graduation packages that included key chains, personalized graduation videos, and a heartfelt message welcoming them to the JHMAA community.

STUDENT AND ALUMNI CONNECTIONS

This year we hosted:

- 2 MedTalks
- 5 Webinars
- 7 Connect the Docs
- 1 PhD Lab-Based Program

Over 800 learners attended these programs and our other events throughout the year. In FY26, the Office of Alumni Relations continued programs for all of our learners, which prepare them with important skills for their careers after they complete their programs.

We also tabled at the medical, graduate student, and trainee orientations, welcoming them with candles and information about the alumni association.

GREETINGS PROGRAM

The Office of Alumni Relations sent 18 greetings/gifts to alumni to celebrate life milestones, including the birth of children, anniversaries, weddings, and more.

VIRTUAL CLASS CONNECTIONS

The SOM Development and Alumni Relations team brought classmates together in meaningful ways through 5 virtual class reunions, proving that distance doesn't diminish connection. These online events gave alumni from across the country an opportunity to reignite friendships, share experiences, and feel the lasting strength of the Hopkins community.

CONFERENCES & REGIONAL PROGRAMS

In FY26, the SOM Development and Alumni Relations team connected with alumni across the country through 5 regional programs and gatherings. These included film screenings in LA and Baltimore, a reception at the National Medical Association Annual Convention and Scientific Assembly, and a dinner at the Association of Medical Illustrators Conference among others—creating valuable opportunities for alumni to build connections, share ideas, and stay engaged with the Hopkins community.



WEBINARS

We partnered with departments at Johns Hopkins Medicine to host 5 virtual webinars, open to all alumni. Webinars focused on topics such as collections at the Institute of the History of Medicine and the restoration of the Four Doctors painting.

The JHMAA continues to support the *Johns Hopkins Medicine Magazine* each year. The SOM Development and Alumni Relations team also contributes stories, class notes, and obituaries. The magazine is published three times per year and reaches over **32,000** subscribers.

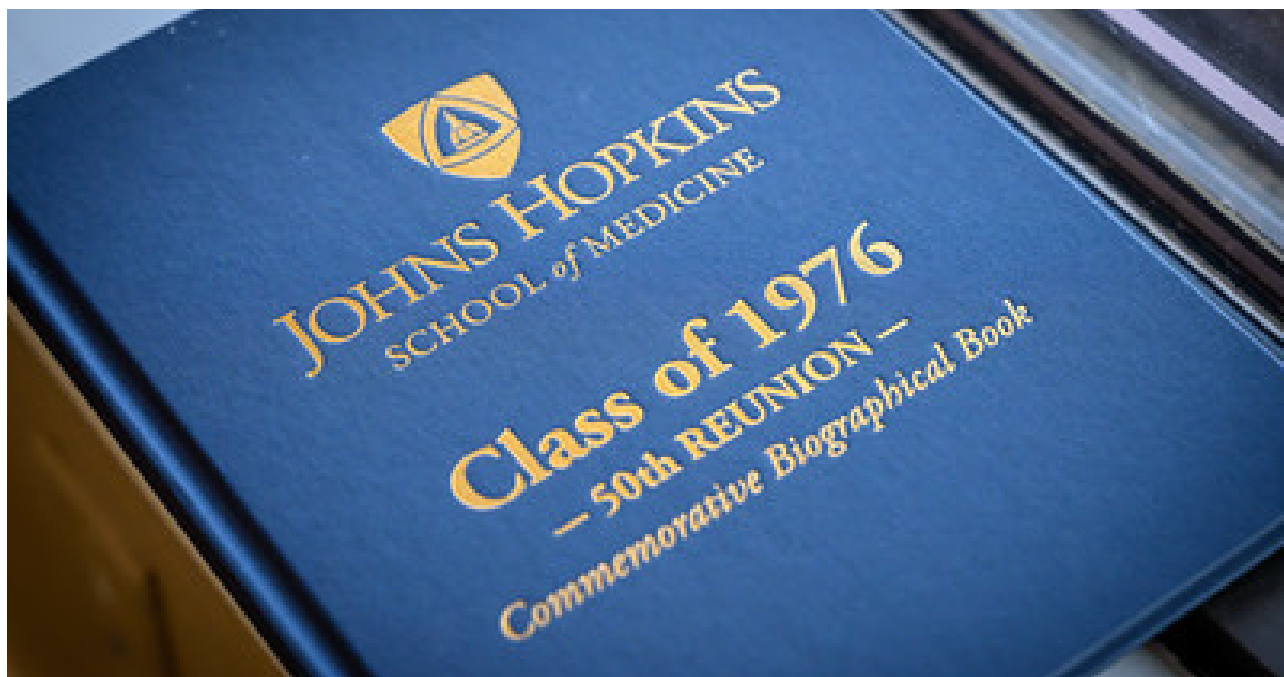

2026 REUNION AND ALUMNI WEEKEND

The 2026 Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine Reunion and Alumni Weekend was hosted on April 17 - April 19 and aligned with the larger institution's reunion and celebration of the 150th, and celebrated milestone reunions for classes ending in 1 and 6. The weekend was full of opportunities for all alumni to reconnect, reminisce, and celebrate.

- A total of 259 alumni and guests registered. More than 450 participants joined virtually, and an estimated 432 attendees checked in for the in-person events.
- 17 medicine-specific programs throughout the weekend, including 12 class dinners.
- 9 awards and 2 portraits were presented.
- Highlights included:
 - Mini Med School at the Blue Jay Kids Club
 - Milestone reunion class dinners
 - Tours of the Simulation Center, the East Baltimore Campus; and historic boat and bus tours of Baltimore City
 - Our highest attended events were the Award and Portrait Presentations, the Johns Hopkins Alumni Association's Annual Meeting, and Hopkins at Home: Medicine and Cutting-Edge Innovation

To support all School of Medicine learners and foster community, the JHMAA launched a grant program to fund innovative projects led by learners that address current needs on campus. In FY26, funding was provided for 7 projects, including 2 Paul B. Rothman Student and Trainee Wellness Grants to support initiatives that specifically aimed to improve the health and well-being of learners at the School of Medicine.

HERE ARE SOME EXAMPLES OF THE TYPES OF PROJECTS OUR GRANT PROGRAM HAS PROUDLY SUPPORTED:

- **Arts in Medicine Society (\$1,500):** Promoting the integration of arts into healthcare settings, recognizing the therapeutic and humanizing power of creative expression in healing.
- **Hopkins Med Sports Initiative (\$1,500):** Promoting health and wellness through sports and physical activity within the medical community and beyond.
- **Understanding Anxiety: A Workshop for Trainees (\$1,499):** Providing resources and education to help medical trainees understand and manage anxiety, promoting mental well-being within the demanding medical field.

Our grant program is continually seeking innovative proposals from learners who are passionate about making a difference. We encourage all learners with impactful ideas to explore how our program can help bring their visions to life.
