Notes:

- Defined differences between mentoring and coaching:
 - o Mentoring – an informal relationship, mentor has no evaluation relationship with mentee. Mentor on leadership and communication skills, and career guidance (not just clinical skills - SON and SOM). No end date.
 - o Coaching – a direct relationship with junior faculty because the mentor is an evaluator of the mentee. Set start and finish dates.
- There exists a formal mentoring program in the School of Public Health.
- Discussed whether we want to offer Academy member services to individual/respective schools only, or to forge connections between the three schools and share cross-specialty expertise. A function of the Academy is to bridge gaps between the three schools and become interdisciplinary.
- Discussed the need for educating mentors on how to be effective mentors.

- The group came up with the idea of tapping into the experiences and expertise of our Academy members to share their own experiences in a 'Happy Hour' or 'Lunch & Learn' setting. - We talked about the website, and specifically the bio-sketches which should detail their personal hobbies.
- It was suggested that there be a members-only section of the website. There is some concern about our Academy site being a public site.
- It was suggested that we have an iPhone photography workshop. Dr. Diane Becker provided a contact for a woman who puts on iPhone photography workshops – Karen Klinedinst.
- Weekend meetups were suggested, either at a restaurant or an Academy member's home. (However, Jennifer did mention that she would be unable to attend, but happy to coordinate logistics ahead of time).
- The group would like to meet again after the first topic-based happy hour.

Next Steps:

- Jennifer to reach out to Karen Klinedinst to setup an iPhone Photography workshop.
- Jennifer to survey Academy members on the types of topics Academy members would be interested in hearing about from other members, and what each member could offer to share about. This would be for informal, casual conversation, topic-based Happy Hours.

Notes:

- Defined precepting as teaching clinical skills. Dr. Silbergeld – no precepting in Public Health.
- There is a need to define the scope of this working group (who are we serving and what is our role) and to differentiate it from other working groups, like Mentoring/Coaching and Community Volunteering.
 - o Teaching/Precepting working group: filling gaps in teaching that are not already covered by departments, rather than duplicating teaching activities. Creating interdisciplinary workshops/sessions for students.
 - o Mentoring/Coaching: mentoring junior faculty.
 - o Community Volunteering: to include mentoring high school students in the community.
- Dr. Slavney would like to teach clinical experience to History of Medicine students, though Dr. Silbergeld mentioned that there is likely not an appetite for this.
- What should be our approach to advertising our services? Dr. Slavney suggested waiting for program directors to approach us, but Dr. Baumgartner has some more proactive ideas: spread the word about the existence of the Academy, get our member bios up on our website to identify areas in which we can teach and highlight specialized knowledge.
- Academy members to put on a workshop for missing curriculum across the disciplines – like a seminar on Death/Dying/Palliative Care.
- Forge a connection with the Krieger Arts & Science School through their Academy. Invite their Academy leadership to one of our Academy Advisory Committee meetings. And also talk with President Ron Daniels when he comes to the February 15th luncheon.

Next Steps:

- Identify stakeholder needs – what are the gaps, what do they have trouble filling?
- Dr. Baumgartner to investigate if there already exists organized sessions for students that tie together the 3 schools.
- Dr. Baumgartner to follow up with Roy Ziegelstein and Sarah Clever for the Transition to Wards courses (SOM), and how our members could participate in teaching these.
- Dr. Baumgartner to send a note to department directors and also present to the ABMF – get their feedback on how they'd like to utilize the service of Academy members (he will do this over the next few months).
- Dr. Baumgartner/Jennifer to invite Krieger Academy leaders to one of our meetings.

Notes:

- Symposia on retirement experiences, given by Academy members. There are two aspects of the retirement experience: navigating pragmatics (financial management, 403b plans, Medicare, etc.), and redefining identity in retirement. We could have a 2-hour program during which each Academy member has about 15 minutes to talk on a certain topic of retirement (so there is little overlap between speakers).
- Two types: Symposia given to Academy members, and symposia given by Academy members to the larger community.
- Re-poll Academy members on the topics on which they'd like to present a symposia.
- Scientific symposia – bring together speakers from different disciplines on a common subject. Example: exercise in prevention and treatment of chronic disease.
- Could our symposia be eligible for CMEs? We could invite a wider audience. Though, we would not want the Academy members to incur a fee for attending.

Next Steps:
