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
# Supporting The Academy's Mission and Members

In summary, the Academy members are fulfilling the mission of the Academy by supporting Johns Hopkins and its community in many ways, including:



### **Teaching/Precepting**

Dr. Rick North serves in his third year as co-chair of the **Teaching and Precepting** Committee, with Dr. Edward Bartlett recently joining him as co-chair. This committee has eight members who are enthusiastic and excited to continue to be involved in teaching students and residents. They participate in numerous programs including the SOM Colleges, APECS (Assessment of Physical Exam and Communication Skills), TTW (Transition to Wards) for Y2 medical students and Clinical Foundations of Medicine (Clinical Skills) for Y1 medical students.

### **Advising/Mentoring/Coaching**

This committee, co-chaired by Drs. Janet Serwint and David Kern since its inception, has eleven dedicated members. In collaboration with the SOM Institute for Excellence in Education (IEE) this committee created a Directory of Academy Mentors and Coaches located on the IEE LinkED website which connects mentees and mentors and coachees with coaches. In 2022, this committee further defined its use of the terms "mentoring," "advising," and "coaching," and updated resources on these topics on the Academy website for Academy mentors, University faculty and trainees. They have worked with the Vice Dean for Faculty to provide resources and advice regarding professionalism, promotion and coaching/mentoring. Finally, they have continued to provide targeted educational events to bolster Academy members' knowledge and skills in these areas.

### Special sessions by this committee in 2022 included:

- Mentoring Across Differences: Part 2 with panelists Drs. Michael Banks, Christopher Golden and Angela Orozco on April 28
- 'Coaching and Mentoring: Sharpening Our Skills and Gaining New Tools' led by Dr. Kimberly Skarupski, Senior Associate Dean for Faculty Development in the School of Medicine, on September 8
- Update on Professionalism Coaching with Dr. Maria Oliva-Hemker, Vice Dean for Faculty in the School of Medicine on December 8

### **Community Volunteering**

This committee, co-chaired by Dr. Dotty Rosenthal and Ms. Ginny Corson, has 16 members who are actively engaged in community projects. In the year 2022, members of this committee met virtually and identified local volunteer opportunities of interest to Academy members, and then met in-person at the volunteer events. In-person events during the continued pandemic presented challenges, and the Academy members stepped up (masked, of course!). This committee formed a partnership with the Harriet Lane Food Pantry and regularly helped staff with their food-bagging events. A partnership was also formed with the First Fruits Farm, a non-profit organization that grows, harvests and provides fresh fruits and vegetables to those in need. Academy members met early in the fields in Freeland, Maryland on some Friday mornings to roll up their sleeves and harvest fresh produce. In addition, committee members met to staff the luncheon service at the Franciscan Center. Other members volunteered individually at organizations with connections to Hopkins such as the Women's Center of Helping Up Mission and a peer-to-peer tutoring program.

Other activities included co-chairs meetings with Dr. Kathleen Page from Centro Sol, a program providing healthcare for Latinos centered at Johns Hopkins Bayview, with leaders from the Johns Hopkins Homewood Academy, and with the investigators of the "Nobody Asked Me" project sponsored by Johns Hopkins University Department of Education to explore

### **Academy Symposia**

This committee, co-chaired by Ms. Amy Deutschendorf and Dr. Kerry Stewart, has 14 members. The committee focuses on organizing symposia given by Academy members presented to fellow Academy members on cross-disciplinary topics. This committee established the popular series called 'Academy Rounds' presented by Academy members. Members of this committee meet regularly to plan for continued events.

- Dr. Richard Lofton, Principal Investigator of the Nobody Asked Me Campaign, presented this initiative on October 13


# Scholarship


# Looking forward
