
Supporting The Academy's Mission and Members

Programs

Teaching/Precepting

Dr. Rick North serves in his third year as co-chair of the Teaching and Precepting Committee, and Dr. Edward Bartlett recently joined him as cochair. This committee has eight members who are enthusiastic and excited to continue to be involved in teaching students and residents. They participate in numerous programs including the SOM Colleges, APECS (Assessment of Physical Exam and Communication Skills) for first year Medical and Family Practice Interns at JHH and JHBMC. TTW (Transition to Wards) for Y2 medical students and Clinical Foundations of Medicine (Clinical Skills) for Y1 medical students. Members also participate in LAC (Longitudinal Ambulatory Clerkship) for Y1 and Y2 medical students, PRECEDE for Y3 and Y4 medical students before and during the Pediatrics Clinical Rotation and also act as Teaching Attending during the Inpatient Rotation at the Bloomberg Children's Center.

Advising/Mentoring/Coaching



This committee, co-chaired by Drs. Janet Serwint and David Kern since its inception, has twelve dedicated members who continue to use their talents of mentoring and teaching students, residents and junior faculty. In collaboration with the SOM Institute for Excellence in Education (IEE) this committee created a Directory of Academy Mentors and Coaches located on both the Academy and the IEE websites which connects mentees and mentors. In 2021, this committee focused significant effort on defining the terms "mentoring," "advising," and "coaching," in order to develop targeted resources on mentoring, being a mentee, and finding a mentor training sessions and panelist events to bolster Academy members' skills. The information developed by this committee, including numerous resources for both Academy mentors and University mentees, is posted publicly on the Academy site.

Community Volunteering

This committee, co-chaired by Ms. Ginny Corson and Dr. Dotty Rosenthal, has 16 members who are actively engaged in community projects. In the year 2021, members of this committee met virtually and identified local volunteer opportunities of interest to Academy members, and then met in-person at the volunteer events. In-person events during the continued pandemic presented challenges, and the Academy members stepped up (masked, of course!). This committee formed a partnership with the Harriet Lane Food Pantry and regularly helped staff their food-bagging events. Members also manned hotlines to schedule Covid-19 vaccination appointments, as well as helped during clinic days at the Henderson-Hopkins School. The partnership with Henderson-Hopkins also included an Academy fundraiser for the school to promote student attendance. The Academy members surpassed the campaign goal of \$1,500 and raised \$1,700. A total of 204 students were recognized for missing fewer than five days of school in 2021, with each receiving a t-shirt that reads 'Attendance Matters'

Academy Symposia

This committee, co-chaired by Ms. Amy Deutschendorf and Dr. Kerry Stewart, has 14 members. The committee focuses on organizing symposia given by Academy members presented to fellow Academy members on cross-disciplinary topics. 
