





"Project Maanasi"



Patient comes directly to the clinic or is brought by the caseworker

Registration at the clinic

Screened for medical & psychiatric illness

Psychometric tools administered

Collateral information collected from family members



"Maanasi Software": Phase-1 Completed

- 1. Complete data migration from handwritten records
- 2. Web Portal with following features
- a. Users Management
- b. Mental Health Patient Information Management including Basic details, medical history, treatment details, follow-ups
 - c. Roles & Permissions management
 - d. Master data management
 - e. Research level advanced search
 - f. Downloading "masked" patient details

 - b. Using Tools from App
 - c. Add/Update Medical History

Project Maanasi - Future Plans

To

- Set up additional Maanasi Clinics
- Improve the visibility of the project to Rotary district, national and International level (has been duplicated in Lithuania and Kenya)
- Collaborate with other Rotary clubs to scale up the project
- Leverage IT to improve efficiency, and patient management
- Provide interactive video conferencing facility for specialists at the Maanasi Clinic
- Raise corpus fund of min. Rs. 2.0 Crores (\$267000) to make the first clinic self sustaining
- Partner with business enterprises for contributions from their CSR budgets to scale up the project



Costs of operation

- One time software production at cost price is \$16000
- All contributions by specialists and Rotarians are free of cost
- One time maintenance cost estimated at about \$3000.00
- Operating costs of clinic are around \$2500 annually for infrastructure upgrade
- Computer systems, Emergency power generators, Communication and Videoconferencing systems, Mobile phones, & increased bandwidth costs: One time expenditure and annual maintenance is estimated at \$7600
- Free medications cost \$5400 annually
- Health workers salaries, transport expenses etc.: \$11000 per year /clinic (for 4 health workers and use of van and 3 scooters)

Fund Raising efforts

- Rotary Foundation Grants
- Fundraisers by Rotarians of Howard West for over 20 years
- Corporate Partners: Adopting one and more Maanasi Clinics from their CSR funds (Corporate Social Responsibility)
- Technology Partners: Contribute funds, equipment and technical expertise for Computing Systems, Printer, Mobile Phones Computers, Video Conferencing Systems, Networking Systems, Software Applications, and yearly operational expenses for one or more Maanasi Clinics
- Medicine Contribution Partners: Providing required medicines for one or more Maanasi Clinics on the yearly basis
- Hospital Partners: The partner to provide free trained doctor care services to the project on long term basis; site used for teaching and research
- Individual Donors: Amounts from \$100 to more
