The Distinguished Teaching Society (DTS) is a program that recognizes residents/faculty who demonstrate excellence in clinical teaching. We ask medical students to nominate residents and attendings that they have worked with on the wards and thought were exceptional educators (forms here: <https://dts.johnshopkins.edu/> nominations close early February 2020). Nominees are then judged based on a rubric that assesses the effectiveness of their teaching style, feedback, and support of students' goals. Inductees are recognized at an induction ceremony in the spring.

SEEKING AFRICAN-AMERICAN AND LATINX MEDICAL STUDENTS INTERESTED IN HIV VACCINE RESEARCH

The development of a safe and effective HIV vaccine is one of the greatest biomedical research challenges of our time. The HIV Vaccine Trials Network (HVTN) is now accepting applications for **Research and Mentorship Program (RAMP) Scholar Awards** to attract African-American and Latinx medical students who want to make a difference in their communities and contribute to the development of an effective HIV vaccine.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS:

- 8-10 week research projects
- Structured mentorship by HVTN investigator(s)
- Travel to an HVTN Clinical Research Site
- Opportunity for international travel (countries in sub-Saharan Africa)
- Attendance at an HVTN Full Group Meeting (May 2021 preferred)
- Oral and poster presentations and potential for publication

PROGRAM RESOURCES:

- Up to USD20,000 for an 8-10 week project
- Funding includes salary, materials, and travel
- Career mentoring and access to HIV vaccine research expertise
- Attendance at a maximum of five training webinars through the course of the year, and a professional development workshop at the conclusion of the program
