



The Johns Hopkins Department of Medicine seeks candidates for the position of **Director of the Division of Palliative Medicine**. The Department of Medicine is among the top departments in National Institutes of Health funding with approximately \$180 million annually in sponsored research funding, and is home to some of the most sought after residency and fellowship programs in the country. The Department has multiple clinical locations including The Johns Hopkins Hospital and Johns Hopkins Bayview Medical Center in Baltimore and Howard County General Hospital, Sibley Memorial Hospital and Suburban Hospital in the greater Baltimore/DC metro area as well as outpatient clinic sites across the region. The Department of Medicine (DOM) is the largest department in the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine with 19 divisions and over 3,000 faculty, nurses, staff and trainees. The DOM is an integral part of Johns Hopkins Medicine (JHM), which includes a partnership between the School of Medicine and the Johns Hopkins Health System (JHHS).

The newly created Division of Palliative Medicine is a freestanding division of the Department of Medicine. The Director of the Division of Palliative Medicine is the spokesperson for the faculty of the Division. The Division Director develops a world class palliative care program for Johns Hopkins Medicine, and works to establish clinical services, exciting and productive research collaborations, and educational programming involving multiple disciplines and specialties/subspecialties. Finally, the Division Director has a unique opportunity to develop and lead a system-wide palliative care program. The successful candidate will oversee—in collaboration with hospital and service line executives—adult palliative care programs across the Johns Hopkins Health System.

Responsibilities include, but are not limited to, promoting faculty; recruiting and appointing new faculty; overseeing educational, clinical and research programs; and planning short term and long term strategic growth. The Division Director reports to the Director of the Department of Medicine and other senior leaders of Johns Hopkins Medicine, as appropriate. The Division Director will be reviewed annually and is appointed on “at will” basis contingent on favorable job performance.

Candidates must have an academic record consistent with appointment as an Associate or Full Professor of Medicine. They must have an MD degree or equivalent and an outstanding record of accomplishments in teaching, research, and clinical service. The successful candidate needs to have the demonstrated capacity to foster an environment in which excellence in teaching, research, scholarship, and clinical programs can simultaneously flourish. A demonstrated commitment to promoting a diverse academic environment is required. Successful candidates will have a record of innovative and effective administrative and fiscal leadership, national stature in his or her field, and a record of excellent interpersonal skills and interactions with students, staff and faculty.
