Question: How long can I access the on-demand conference content?

Answer:

Question: How do I access the post-conference evaluation?

Answer:

- The post-conference evaluation was sent via email on 4/30 and 5/21 from The Johns Hopkins AMP Team via ai_elearn@jhmi.edu. The evaluation must be completed to receive **your certificate of completion**.

Question: When and how do I receive my certificate?

Answer:

- Once the post-conference evaluation is completed, you should receive a separate email immediately with the link to print your certificate of completion.
- Following the closure of the evaluation on July 8th, the CME office will send an email no later than July 30th with the link to claim your CME/credit certificates.
 - CME certificates will indicate the number of hours attested by the physician group in the evaluation.

- The credit certificates for all others will state the information that we shared in the brochure/syllabus (see 2nd page).

Question: I am not a physician; how does my professional board know how many hours I attended?

Answer: You indicate the credit hours that you completed when submitting to your professional board/renewing license. Please see the additional page below for further information on the credit statements.
