

The Johns Hopkins Sarcoidosis Clinic

To make the most of your new patient visit, please send us your records and radiology images that will help us understand your case of sarcoidosis from how it was initially diagnosed and how it may have changed over time.

Additional items that are helpful include:

- All biopsy reports that help confirm your diagnosis.
- Office notes (past 1 year) from your primary doctor and any other specialists you may have seen for your sarcoidosis.
- All radiology reports (past 2 years) related to finding and monitoring your sarcoidosis. This includes but is not limited to x-rays, CT scans, PET/CT scans, and MRI scans.
- **All radiology images on CD disks.** This may need to be specifically requested from the radiology facility where the radiology studies were performed. The CDs can be uploaded to <https://jhhsimagesharing.ambrahealth.com> or brought to your clinic visit.
- Blood and urine test results, electrocardiogram (ECG) (at least past 1 year).
- Any other test results that may be important to your case. For example, if you have sarcoidosis in your heart, you should bring copies of your heart-related tests (echocardiogram, stress test, catheterization, cardiac MRI, cardiac PET/CT, Holter monitoring, cardiac event monitoring, electrophysiology study).

Although not required, a short letter from your referring doctor would be very helpful to provide an overview of your sarcoidosis history.

- A list of the doctors that help take care of your sarcoidosis and their contact information would be very helpful.
