To Johns Hopkins Hospital, health system and university faculty and staff on the East Baltimore campus

Dear Colleagues

Beginning Saturday, Aug. 1, Johns Hopkins will offer free parking — for a limited time — in the Caroline Street and Washington Street garages for Johns Hopkins Hospital, health system and university employees on the East Baltimore campus who have been paying for parking on a daily basis.

As you may recall, on July 1 Johns Hopkins Health System announced a four-month suspension of parking fees for employees who pay for monthly parking via direct deposit. Unfortunately, this important benefit did not support employees working on the East Baltimore campus who pay for parking daily, and not through direct deposit. This initiative will **offer free parking from Aug. 1 through Nov. 30 for employees who pay daily for parking**. Regular parking fees will resume on Dec. 1.

The garages that will offer free daily parking are:

- Caroline Street garage – [1501 E. Monument Street](#)
- [Washington Street](#) garage – 701 N. Washington Street

To park for free in the Caroline Street and Washington Street garages, obtain a daily parking ticket at the entrance gate. When you are ready to exit the garage, process your ticket at a cashier station and show the cashier your employee ID card. **Do not attempt to process the free parking at an automated machine.**

Other garages on the East Baltimore campus will not be included in this initiative so that we can maintain parking availability for our patients and visitors. As a reminder, employees and students may continue to park for free in these garages Monday–Friday from 3 p.m. to 10 a.m., and all day on Saturday, Sunday and designated holidays.
