New Seven-Day Supply Limit for Opioid-Naïve Priority Partners Members

Effective Date: April 20, 2021

Lines of Business Affected: Priority Partners

Type of Change: Process

Explanation of Change:

In accordance with recent guidance from the Maryland Department of Health (MDH), Priority Partners will adopt the following safety alerts at pharmacies starting April 20, 2021:

- Opioid prescriptions will be limited to a seven-day supply limit for opioid-naïve Priority Partners members (i.e. members who have not recently filled an opioid prescription within the previous 108 days). The pharmacist can dispense up to a seven-day supply of an initial prescription, per state regulations.
 - o If a prescriber writes another prescription for an additional days-supply, or any subsequent opioid prescriptions, those prescriptions are not subject to the seven-day supply limit because the member will no longer be considered opioid-naïve.
 - o If a prescriber believes that an opioid-naïve member will need more than an initial seven-day supply of medication, the prescriber may submit an Opioid Prior Authorization Form to obtain a quantity limit exception. Prior authorization requests may be submitted electronically through CoverMyMeds® or Surescripts®, or by fax (faxing directions included on form). Providers should include clinical documentation with the request, attesting to the medical necessity for an initial supply that is greater than seven days.
